



## General Information

Thank you for your request. Please fill out the information on preceding page and either mail or email it to the attention of the Collections Management Department. Permission is granted at the sole discretion of the Greenville County Museum of Art (GCMA). Permission to reproduce is conditional upon acceptance of these regulations. Any breach of these terms and conditions will result, at the sole discretion of the GCMA, in revocation of permission to reproduce.

### Timing

Please allow four weeks for processing requests. A rush fee may be implemented for expedited orders.

### Payment

Prepayment is required before image is released; checks or money orders are accepted, and should be made payable to the GCMA. You will receive an electronic invoice. Quoted fees expire sixty days after date of issue.

### Conditions

1. All reproductions must be made from photographic materials supplied by the GCMA. Reproduction from printed or other non-photographic materials is strictly prohibited.
  2. Full documentation (as written on page 1) must accompany the reproduction, either directly under it, on the page facing, on the reverse, or elsewhere in the publication, such as in the index or list of illustrations. In the case of filmstrips, films, video, etc., the information must appear either in an adjacent frame, in the credits, or in accompanying materials.
  3. Permission is granted for only ONE usage in ONE publication, ONE edition, ONE print run and ONE language. Any further reproduction shall require an additional fee and the written permission of the GCMA.
  4. The reproduction must be printed in full-tone black and white or full color and may not be reproduced on colored stock. Nothing may be superimposed on the reproduction (i.e. lettering or another image).
  5. The work of art must be reproduced in its entirety and must not bleed off the page or be cropped in any way. The reproduction of a specific detail must be approved in advance by the GCMA and the fact that it is a detail noted in the documentation accompanying the reproduction.
  6. The GCMA requires upon publication, without charge, one copy of the publication in which the reproduction appears. Please send the publication to Collections Management, Greenville County Museum of Art.
  7. The GCMA gives no exclusive rights to any publisher, author, or photographer and makes no warranties or representations and assumes no responsibility whatsoever for any claims against applicant or the GCMA by an artist, his agent, estate or any other party in connection with the reproduction of works of art in the collection of the GCMA. Additionally, the applicant agrees to indemnify the GCMA and hold it harmless against any and all such claims, including copyright infringement claims, royalty or fee demands and/or actions, including the costs thereof, arising as a result of the applicant's reproduction of the works of art in the collection of the GCMA.
- It is the responsibility of the publisher to directly contact copyright owner and obtain permission. Reproductions of all copyrighted works must bear the copyright notice as prescribed by the Copyright Act of 1976 of the United States. The Museum can grant the permission requested only to the extent of its ownership of the rights relating to the request.
- Copyright ownership and/or reproduction rights may be retained by the artist for works of art created after January 1, 1978. Any and all royalty payments or other requirements specified by the copyright owner of such a work must be adhered to by the publisher or agent requesting reproduction permission.
8. The GCMA reserves the right to review all copy relevant to the work of art before granting permission to reproduce the artwork.

Any unauthorized use of photographic materials supplied by the GCMA by any person or entity, for any reason, will render the applicant responsible and liable to the GCMA for appropriate compensation and other costs, regardless of whether the applicant has profited or is responsible for such unauthorized use.
  10. The GCMA reserves the right, at its sole discretion, to refuse permission for further applications from a publisher or other applicant, if in its opinion, acceptable standards of reproduction of the GCMA objects have not been obtained or if adherence to the terms of previous contracts has not been upheld.
